RE-OPENING CHURCH PREMISES - SAFETY PLAN Synod has stipulated that every group that either meets in the name of Eastwood Uniting Church (including Bible studies in a home) or uses the Church premises for any activity, must provide Church Council with a safety plan that complies with regulations and guidelines set out by both the NSW Government and the NSW/ACT Synod. Chris Wakefield has kindly agreed to be our contact person with Synod on behalf of Church Council. ALL groups are required to complete and submit a safety plan to Church Council. Safety plans will be forwarded to Synod and Presbytery for review. Complying with all the current regulations is very complex and expensive. Until further notice the Church buildings remain closed. LATEST COVID-19 GUIDANCE NOTE. The NSW Government has announced that COVID-19 restrictions will tighten. Given the restrictions and curfew people of Victoria are facing reminds us the second wave is a real and very present threat to the health and well-being of people in NSW and the ACT.

Please pray for the people of Victoria, in particular in Melbourne as they face difficult weeks to come.

The Chief Health officer, Dr. Kerry Chant recently wrote to religious leaders highlighting the high risk face to face gatherings pose for further outbreaks. https://nswact.uca.org.au/communications/newsroom/chief-health-officer-urges-church-leaders-to-be-vigilant/.

In reminding us that 'no border is impenetrable', the Premier of NSW has said 'I cannot stress how critical the next few weeks are.'

The Premier of NSW stressed that while these recommendations are not compulsory, they are made to keep people safe and minimise the risk of further outbreaks.

As a result, the Synod of NSW-ACT strongly recommends that:

- All congregations in NSW and ACT refrain from face to face gatherings at this time. Services should continue to be streamed or recorded to enable people to engage in worship.
- This includes Youth Groups, Kids clubs, Sunday Schools and other missional and social groups.
- Should any congregation or group elect to gather face to face, every participant should wear a face mask.
- No singing of any kind. This includes community, congregational or choir led singing. No singing applies even if people wear a mask.
- Baptisms to be postponed wherever possible.
- Third party hires and op shops remain under the oversight of the church council. In line with the Premier's recommendation, every attention should be given to ensure masks are worn (where physical distancing is hard to maintain and in settings where there is a high risk of transmission) and strict hygiene followed.

It is vital that each of us do what we can to protect the people in our care and communities. Please pray for one another as we look forward to the day when we will be together again – healthy and safe.

With a heavy heart, I provide this further Guidance Note.

Our two Armenian Ministers, Rev Krikor Youmshajekian and Rev Hagop Sarkissian, are both Lebanese Australians with family and friends in Beirut and the region; add to that the Rev Gaby Kobrossi at Bankstown Uniting Church who is also a Lebanese Australian. Moreover the explosion in the port area of Beirut was very close to the Armenian quarter; Armenian Schools, Churches, Church Schools and Preschools, Homes and Businesses have been badly damaged. Fortunately it is the summer vacation time in Lebanon and no schools or preschools were operating, however the damage and injuries will be significant for all the people of a country that is so badly affected at this time. Please continue to pray for the people of Lebanon and Beirut, and especially for our Christian Armenian friends in that part of the world and here. Blessings,

THIS WEEK'S PRAYERS prepared by Marion Gledhill Matthew 14: 22-33 - 'We are "boat people"!

Yes God, we feel we are caught in the stormy seas of COVID-19

We fear what extended not-normal time is doing to us. We miss our friends and we miss the enjoyment of the activities we used to do.

We fear the economic consequences of the restrictions.

We fear that Victorian peak numbers may also be seen here.

We fear for our families.

We fear for people without work and for businesses that may close.

God, when we feel close to sinking beneath the waves of our fears, give us courage and trust to take the hand you hold out to us, remembering Jesus who reached out to hold Peter.

We pray, dear God, for people who are ill with the virus, their families and health professionals that they will discover they too can take your hand, and find the reassurance and care you offer.

We pray for all involved in aged care, in Victoria and in all parts of Australia, that they will find the resources needed to give proper care, and we pray for aged care residents fearing infection.

We join with UnitingCare Australia to pray that the government will lead the development of a COVID-19 National Response Plan for Homeless People Sleeping Rough.

We pray for all those seeking asylum in our land, for their supporters, and for the Australian Government, that asylum seekers' dignity as fellow human beings may be respected, and that a resolution to their long-term future may be found.

We pray that those seeking asylum and their families may be given all the resources Australia has to offer to live a life of human dignity while the processes around their future are followed through.

Gracious God, at this time when National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day has just passed, we acknowledge the deep hurt experienced by the children and the families of the Stolen Generation. We pray for those who as children suffered terribly from forcible removal from their family and community.

We pray for those children who grew up away from their own culture, contributing to the loss of their own sense of self-identity. We recognise that these sufferings cause intergenerational trauma. May Your healing presence be felt by all impacted by this trauma.

Help us to celebrate the lives of children as you taught us in scripture "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." Lord, please hear our prayers for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children. We pray these children learn their culture from Elders. We pray these children grow to be strong leaders in their communities. We pray they grow to feel empowered. We pray they grow to know their voice counts. We pray they always encounter Your grace.

We thank you for the work of Nungalinya College in Darwin, where the Anglican and Uniting Churches together offer education in Christian life and theology to Indigenous young people and adults. We join with the staff and students to praise You for provision and protection during COVID-19 times, and thank you for comfort and guidance to students through times of suffering and sadness. Please bless and guide the staff as they plan long-term directions.

We pray for the Congregation of Eastwood Uniting Church. May all our people reach out to take the hand you offer. Help us to remember that no matter how stormy the sea, you are, and always will be, with us.

May our Church Council, Nicholas, Tennyson and Esther be strengthened and guided as they rely on You. We pray for any of our Congregation who are unwell, grieving or struggling to cope. Bless them, gracious God.

Thank you for the guidance provided by the Synod and the Assembly of the UCA, and please hold their leaders firmly in your hand.

With the World Council of Churches and Churches across the world we continue to pray for African nations and their Churches. This week we pray for Burkina Faso, Chad, Mali, Mauritania, and Niger.

We are thankful for:

- the heritage of ancient trade routes, rich oral traditions and nomadic practices of people in the lands these countries now occupy
- humanitarian work to improve food security and livelihoods, especially for women
- pro-active efforts to preserve the environment in these desert lands
- welcome and provision for those who often must flee across borders.

We pray for:

- those impoverished who lack basic needs and rights, that these will be met
- desperate children and others who turn to crime or begging or become enslaved
- effective response to the frequent droughts and hunger in this area
- more stable political rule in these countries to stem violence and provide for all.
